BMX Community Fun Day

This event was planned and delivered in conjunction with several other local organisations along side of Enthusiasm, including Derby City Council, Derby Homes, Cycle Derby, Police, SCX and OSCAR. All were involved in planning, delivery and offering their time for free.

On the day of the event we had in excess of 500 people from around the local area attend. Activities included; BMX workshops, Bike Doctor, Bike stamping, free bike locks and lights, inflatable's, free food, local stalls, football workshops delivered by Derby County, we also opened the youth centre to provide an indoor space and several other smaller activities including Arts and Crafts, pool, Table Tennis music and Xbox.

Setbacks

teacher strikes the event was pulled at the very last minute. We were also scheduled to support a local running club at a small event they were hosting, but due to communication issues this also did not go ahead.

We are on target to deliver/support the four events set out in the SLA. As explained below further events are being looked at and planned with young people we work with in the ABL area.

Plans for next reporting period

What are you going to do next? Are there any activities we should know about?

Enthusiasm youth workers are currently working in conjunction with Adele Styles, who runs Derby City Council Youth Board and Derby Homes Youth Board. We are working with a small group of young people from our Allenton youth club, to plan and deliver 2 events in Allenton over the coming months. Planning sessions have begun, with a few ideas being passed around. Dates are still to be confirmed which we will inform you of once in place.

Moorhead / Allenton School have also been approached again to see if we can help support any events they have coming up over the next few months. We are still awaiting a response for this.

Annual General Meeting – This is planned for January 10th 2017 and will take place from St. Martins Hall. Again this will be advertised nearer the date to make the community aware.

Due to the huge success and popularity of Santa and the Reindeers at Allenton Market, Nacro will be delivering a similar event again this December.
